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FIRST QUARTERLY GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT ESTIMATE, SECOND QUARTER OF 2023

The estimation of the gross domestic product (GDP) for the second quarter of 2023 is presented by major categories of expenditure and according to the NKD 2007 activity sections.

The quarterly GDP data focus on short-term movements of the economy, while the main purpose of the quarterly GDP estimate is the calculation of real growth rates.

The estimate shows that the quarterly GDP in real terms increased by 2.7% in the second quarter of 2023, as compared to the same quarter of 2022.

Seasonally adjusted quarterly GDP increased by 1.1% compared to the previous quarter and increased by 2.5% in real terms compared to the same quarter of 2022.

A real growth is visible in most of the GDP categories on the expenditure side, except in categories NPISH and imports and exports of goods.

The first estimate shows that the quarterly GVA increased in real terms by 2.1% in the second quarter of 2023, as compared to the same quarter of 2022, based on non-adjusted

The increase in GVA was mainly influenced by a significant increase in real value added of financial and insurance activities, professional, scientific, technical activities and administrative and support service activities.

In Statistics in Line, the data by major categories of expenditure and according to the NKD 2007 activity sections at current prices, constant prices of the previous year, constant prices of the reference year (2015 = 100) and real growth rates are presented.
